Letter From Pastor

The season of Lent is a gift. It is a gift because it provides us with the opportunity to take stock of our lives and seriously consider how we have been living the life God has given us, life as followers of Jesus. If that is not enough, we have been given this opportunity wrapped in the grace of a God who created us, loves us despite our flaws, and will not cast us aside even if what we discover about ourselves seems unredeemable and leaves us feeling unworthy of the abundant forgiveness God freely offers each of us without exception.

Likewise, Lent is also an invitation to take seriously our faith. We are graciously invited to reorder our priorities and once again, or maybe for the first time, place our faith and our relationship with God at the top of the list rather than placing it somewhere on the list where it conveniently meets our needs or fits neatly into our schedules. In my experience, we treat our relationships with God assuming it will always be there for us whenever we have time for it or when it comes in handy. We choose to do this instead of making that relationship our most important relationship and a conscious part of our daily lives.

I encourage each of us to accept the invitation and the gift that the season of Lent and God are graciously offer. I encourage us to reclaim the faith we have each been given by God and sort out and reorder our lives in a manner that places our relationships with God at the top of the list. Push aside those other things that we have made into gods, replacing the God who loves us with things that are fleeting and in the long run cannot sustain us or give us life.

God has not forgotten us. God has not placed us further down on the list. Let us likewise make God and our relationship with God the central focus of our lives, for it is our committed involvement in that relationship that makes all things well. It is that relationship that guides us through our daily lives and sustains us when we need to feel God's love most.

May your Lenten seasons be blessed with meaningful discoveries and a renewed relationship with your God and his beloved son, our life-giving savior, Jesus Christ.
