Weakness is a Strength

"...to keep me from being too elated, a thorn was given me in the flesh, a messenger of Satan to torment me, to keep me from being too elated. ⁸ Three times I appealed to the Lord about this, that it would leave me, ⁹ but he said to me, 'My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness.' So I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may dwell in me. ¹⁰ Therefore I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and calamities for the sake of Christ, for whenever I am weak, then I am strong." 2 Corinthians 12:7b-10

Are the weaknesses we possess, the thorns in our flesh which are no fault of our own, liabilities, or potential assets we might steward to bring us closer to God and experience a more intimate relationship with our Creator?

Paul does not identify the thorn he carries in him nor its nature. Paul, as one who understands human nature well, wisely keeps this information to himself because, let's face it, we would likely compare our thorns to his and quickly dismiss ours as having little or no spiritual value when placed side by side with Paul's. Of course, we would be wrong in making that assumption.

I have recently been considering the thorns (weaknesses) that jab at me daily and make certain aspects of life far more challenging than I would like them to be. In doing so, unlike Paul, I find my ability to embrace them consistently as assets challenging. However, I strive to experience these thorns with gratitude for their power to draw me closer to God, increase my understanding of my dependency on God's faithfulness, and strengthen my faith in God's ever-present power in my life. I am reminded that I need God to weather the weaknesses and experience His presence in them, transforming them into assets I can use to enhance my ministry to others while deepening my relationship with our gracious God. Stewardship Special Giving for September: Konde Diocese - Our Partner in Ministry

You may or may not know that each of the sixty-five synods of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America has been linked with a Lutheran companion synod or church body outside the United States with which to partner in ministry and provide each other support through prayer and opportunities to engage with each other. We in the Lower Susquehanna Synod have been blessed with the companionship of the Konde Diocese, part of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Tanzania (ELCT). The Konde Diocese at present boasts a membership of over 125,000 members in seven church districts. Within these seven districts, more than 100 congregations are served by 160 pastors and 200 evangelists serving God's people and spreading the Good News of Jesus Christ, which they have been faithfully doing since 1977.

The operative word in beginning to understand the nature of this ministry partnership and its benefits is "companion." Each of our synods/dioceses and the congregations that make up these bodies are called to serve our neighbor and share the life-giving gospel of Jesus Christ. Doing so, whether one is part of a congregation in Ephrata, Pennsylvania, or a congregation in a village in the Konde Diocese, we can offer encouragement for each other's challenges and celebrate the joys. Through this relationship, the work we have been called to do becomes easier and more meaningful because we know there are siblings in Christ offering mutual support. Such a relationship also provides the opportunity to learn from each other through correspondence and sharing ideas. This is especially relevant as we in this nation struggle with shrinking congregations and a waning interest in organized religion. Christian churches in Africa and other less developed parts of the world are experiencing a boom in persons embracing the Gospel and its grace-filled message.

During September, the Konde Diocese will be our stewardship focus. I encourage us to prayerfully consider how we can actively engage in a relationship with the diocese and its individual congregations—supporting their ministries as they support ours. To help us

deepen our connection, we are working with our synodical liaison with the ELCT to link the Holy Trinity with a congregation in the Konde Diocese with whom we can personally have contact and grow our relationship from congregation to congregation.

Bergstrasse Community Clothing Closet is open the first full weekend of every month for persons in need of clothing and other household goods. Entrance is accessible via the door off the lower parking lot. Hours are Saturday noon – 2pm and Sunday 11am – 1pm.

Fall/Winter Schedule: Sept 7th and 8th Oct 5th and 6th Nov 2nd and 3rd Dec 7th and 8th



Donations: Currently there is a desperate need for men's pants, shorts and shoes. There is always a need for children's clothing. All clothing in good shape is accepted as are household items like sheets, towels, etc. Donations may be dropped off directly at Bergstrasse when the Community Clothing Closet is open or in the box at the back of the narthex in Holy Trinity. **Volunteers**: sort clothing, hang it and tag it by color to keep track of what is moving and what is not,

and greet shoppers at the courtesy desk. Shoppers check in and specify how many people they are shopping for and what items are of particular interest. Volunteers meet at 6-7:30pm on the Friday before the Closet is open to sort donations and get them ready for the next day. When the Closet is open, volunteers are needed from 11:30 - 2:30 on Saturdays and 10:30 - 1:30 on Sundays. You do

not need to be there the entire time to volunteer – whatever time you have available within those times is fine.
